Goodwill of Santa Clara County was founded in 1926, and ex-

ists to assist people with disabilities and other barriers to employment achieve their highest potential by offering them a broad range of vocational, occupational and educational services. The nonprofit agency is nearly 100% self-supported by retail sales of donated clothing, household items and autos, and by revenues from contract production and business services.
