I would love to keep in regular touch with your club and one way which comes to my mind is by thinking of working together in some Matching Grant Projects where my home club the Rotary Club of Delhi Mid Town and the RI Dist. 3010 could jointly identify areas of common interest and work for the community not only in India but also in areas like Afghanistan, Nepal and Bangladesh where the needs are as many, if not more.

We are now in the final stage of Polio Eradication and Rotary has to continue giving its support and provide the leadership and funding which are both very critical issues. Your Club and the District will be raising money as would be all the Rotary Clubs worldwide to the tune of US \$ 80 million and meet the "Funding Gap" of US \$ 275 million within this Rotary Year. I hope my talk in your club would help you to meet your targets.
