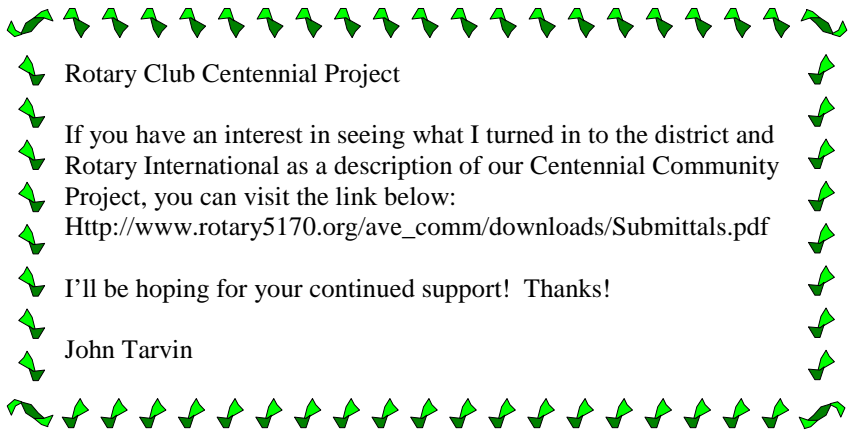


MORGAN HILL ROTARY GOLF TOURNAMENT

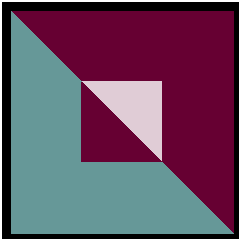
