We were honored to be one of the first clubs visited by District Governor Don Allen (Cupertino club) and Assistant District Governor Rick Heinzen (Gilroy Club).

Don recognized Arlene Greenberg for the stupendous job she did as Chair of the District Conference. He also applauded Gary Sargenti for his work on sponsorships for the conference, and Roger Knopf for his efforts as District Membership Chair last year.

Info about our District – 5710. It includes Alameda,

Santa Clara, San Benito and Santa Cruz counties. There are 57 current clubs and two provisional clubs, totaling 4200 Rotarians.

Rotary International – President Jonathan’s theme is “Lend a Hand.” There is an emphasis this year on the Family of Rotary – Rotarians reaching out to fellow Rotarians who are facing challenging times – divorce, family problems, grief, illness, etc. Don said we need to be willing to open up to each other, so we can support each other.

As a recent survivor of colon cancer, Don emphasized how important it is to have the exam. 675 people in Santa Clara County will die from colon cancer this year. So, put your shyness and

discomfort aside and talk to your doctor about this.

Rotary is now at the 99th percentile for eradicating polio. We must complete this work. Also, we are going to be focusing efforts on our mission to bring peace to the world. On the local level, Rotary is providing COG’s – Club Opportunity Grants – to support efforts that will have lasting and significant effects. More info will come on this.
