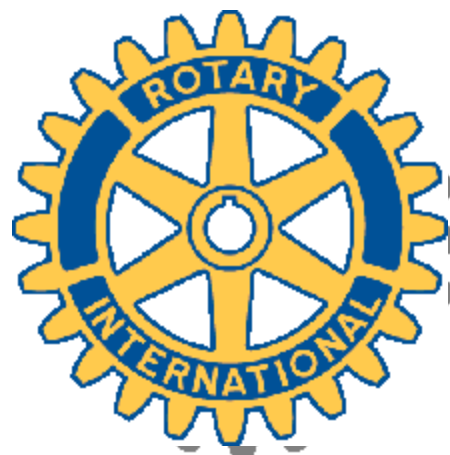

This Weeks Programs Highlight

President Steve introduces Bob Martin who was a member of our Rotary and who is a graduate in Journalism. Bob moved to S. California and then back to M.H. to join Media Arts. Bob works on Leadership M.H. presently.

Bob Martin says he is a little nervous about people who do great things and great deeds in M.H. Bob expressed gratitude to all Rotarians and especially co-sponsoring two students and raising 42K at a fundraiser, thank you M.H. Rotary.

Bob wanted us to look at a day in the life for Leadership M.H. It is a three hour course or a full day. Although Bob put detailed flyers on all tables, some aspects of the outline stood out and I would like to express these here.

First is the first amendment which states ' Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the government for redress of grievances'. (WOW!).

Bob cited that a free press is not guaranteed but it is protected! Media is Business! The story will be written, broadcast, televised, with or without you. Journalists are human beings!

In the all day seminar, presentations start at 8:15 am and include presentations on 'working with the media', communication exercises, discussions and a tour of Media Arts.

Unfortunately I had to leave about 10 minutes early but found the hand outs and talk by Bob extremely insightful and truly made me think about the great country we live in and the protections offered to all on the first amendment. Thank you Bob!
