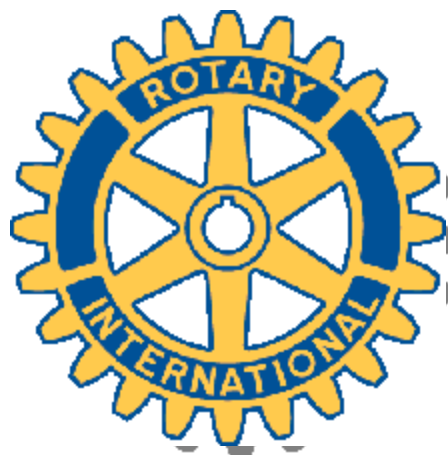

This Weeks Programs Highlight

Erik Cohen introduces Kriss Costa from the County of Santa Clara!

Kriss is the head of Vector Patrol and especially watches over the developments of the 'West Nile Virus'. Her job is outdoors and her main focus is to Protect the Health and Safety of all residents in SCC.

The West Nile Virus brings 'encephalitis' and can bring death to humans. The cycle is mosquito's to Birds to Mosquito's and back to Birds again. It can be transmitted to horses also and certain mammals. The elderly and young children are particularly susceptible to being infected by the West Nile Virus. The West Nile Virus is mosquito born and comes from the middle east. There are 2-3 cases in southern California every yr. The infection period is 3-14 days and feels like the summer flu with headaches, body aches, skin rash, fever and neck stiffness. Only 20% of people will show symptoms and in a serious case recovery could take up to 12 months.

Last year over 4 thousand cases and 200 deaths occurred. All human blood now has to be tested for the West Nile Virus.

There are 36 species of mosquito's that are possible carriers of the West Nile Virus. Over 160 birds are affected also.

To date, 2874 cases and 53 deaths have been reported and it has spread since 199 across the U.S. to AZ., NV., CO., WY., and MT.

Is California ready? Kriss believes so and SCC has been doing testing since 1915. Today, testing is done in 50 districts, mosquito specific testing, and SCC has a response plan in force since before 1999.

What can we do; check our backyards for standing water, for dead birds and wear personal protection (repellent) and loose clothing. For information call 1-800-314-2427.
