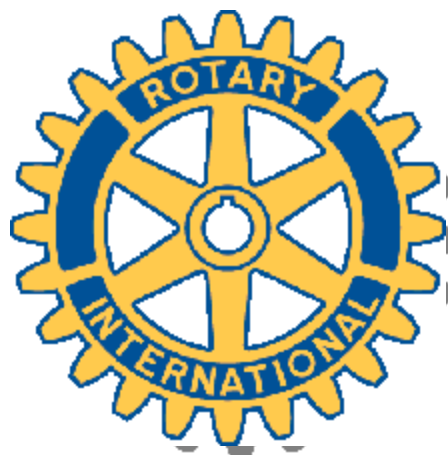

This Weeks Programs Highlight

Erik Cohen introduces Special Agent Michael Gimbel from the FBI!

Michael Gimbel is from the San Francisco/ San Jose Office/ agency of the FBI. Michael Gimbel currently serves on the International Terrorism Task Force and is the Team Leader on Critical Incidents. There is also a Domestic Terrorism FBI Agent and there are three teams in the South Bay.

Michael Gimbel is also the liason for the PGA and the Sharks. Michael Gimbel proceeded to give a brief history of the FBI starting with J. Edgar Hoover which was created on July 26th, 1908.

Some famous cases that the FBI headed up are Al Capon, Lindberg, Pan AM 103. The current director is Robert Mueller and there are 56 main offices. In the bay area, San Jose and Oakland are the largest and they have 70 agents in total. San Jose is set up to handle any Terrorism incident according to Michael. Al Quida is set up like a corporation with numerous divisions and they are plotting against the USA every day.

Will something happen like 911, Michael believes so and suggest that we all must be aware of our surroundings. In addition to the Terrorism Task Force, there are other agencies like Violent Crimes, White Collar, High Tech and Asian Organized Crime.

The definition of Terrorism in short is Violence, Fear and intimidation. The priority at the present time is to prevent Terrorism, in fact it's their mission.

Michael Gimbel said that the go ahead for 911 was given by one person and Michael showed many slides of the 911 incident, and other bombing across the globe.

The FBI has formed Joint Terrorism Task Forces with 25 local and state/ federal agencies. Local agencies do include Police. The Bay Area Terrorism Working Group is an Intelligence organization. Some sub programs include 'Target' listings such as the Golden Gate Bridge.
