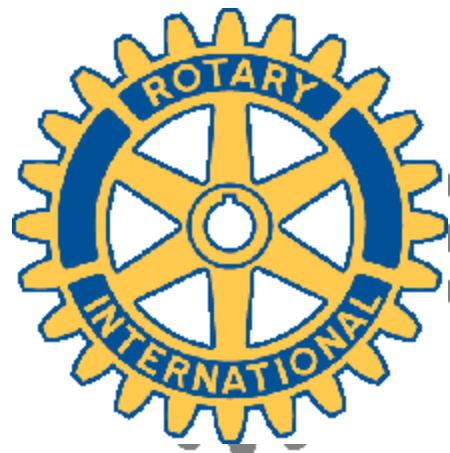

A major study that offers a 10-year forecast of the demographic changes that will impact our region will be presented at Wednesday's meeting. The Rotary Club of Morgan Hill is pleased to welcome Carl Guardino, President and CEO of the Silicon Valley Manufacturing Group (SVMG), to present the study, "Projections: Silicon Valley 2004." This work was a major focus of a daylong interactive community forum in September that brought together 500 non-profit, governmental and corporate professionals to Santa Clara University for the purpose of looking at our future with an eye towards shaping it, rather than merely accepting it.

The SVMG is a public policy trade association that represents 190 of Silicon Valley's most respected private sector employers, who collectively provide more than 250,000 jobs in Silicon Valley.
