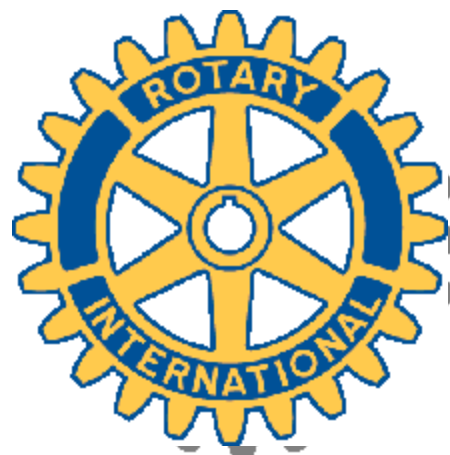

This Weeks Programs Highlight

Sherry Hemingway introduced Carl Guardino, Executive Director of South Valley Manufacturing Group. Carl shared highlights of the *Projections: 04 Silicon Valley* report on housing, transportation, education, environment and energy.

The SVMG is a public policy trade association that represents 190 of Silicon Valley's most respected private sector employers, who collectively provide more than 250,000 jobs in Silicon Valley.

SVMG was founded in 1978 and presently there are 190 employers. Recently the San Jose Mercury News said that Carl is one of the 10 most powerful people in SV.

Some results are:

- 2.7 million people and 1.3 million jobs are in the 30 cities of the SVMG.
- Birth attributes largely to growth
- Slow improvement in employment
- Housing has gone up
- Home affordability has grown slightly from 16% to 23%
- Affordability is getting further away from SVMG

The academic performance index IE: student achievement has shown that 25 of the 50 states has non-credentialed teachers and SV has 15% non credentialed teachers.

There are 56 languages spoken and 25% are English learners.

With respect to the water supply, in essence, if we have back to back dry years we will be in trouble.

Energy: if you have 40% in state, you can survive blackouts etc, we have 22% currently.
