## Club Honored with Rotary International Presidential Citation

Rotary Club of Morgan Hill has been awarded a 2005-06 Presidential Citation by Rotary International President Carl-Wilhelm Stenhammer of Denmark. The award was given for the club's international service work.

The citation was awarded "for demonstrating excellence and for exemplary achievement in Rotary's second century of service through public image initiatives and continued effort in club, community, vocational and international service."

## World Community Service Projects Funded

World Community Service reports that three of Morgan Hill's matching grants have been approved by the Rotary Foundation: Bolivian orphanage, \$16,951; Mexican ambulance, \$14,782; and Panama children's burn clinic, \$45,000 (Arlene's District project). The total is \$76,733, an amount that can make a huge impact in these countries.

In addition, a project with Bulgaria is pending and a project in The Philippines is complete.

## Rotarians Walk & Raise Funds in ACS Relay for Life

Morgan Hill Rotarians walked the talk in the Relay for Life May 20-21, and ranked sixth among all teams in fundraising. The Morgan Hill event raised more than \$170,000, with \$14,000 of that turned in by Rotarians.

The club's 14 walkers kept 1-3 representatives on the track for each of the 24 hours, with Ramona Etchebarne and event organizer Steven Stratton pulling extra duty when club members missed their time slots. Ramona walked 6 hours, and Steven, who lost his wife to cancer in 1998, walked 17.

One of the most moving parts of the event occurred at dusk at the lighting of the luminarias lining the entire track. Each candle-lit sack was donated in honor or in memory of someone affected by cancer.

Top fundraisers were Steve Stratton at \$2,700,

John & Sherry Hemingway at \$1,975 and Jim & Amanda Jeisel at \$1,465.

In the midst of the frivolity of the 50s flashback, Rotarians had a serious purpose when they hosted “Let’s Go to the Hop II” on June 2 at the Morgan Hill Community & Cultural Center.

The event’s goals were to manage a well-publicized public event, raise public awareness of the club that could result in increased membership, offer the community an affordable event that would attract attendees from outside the membership; provide a quality experience for attendees, and generate funds for the Club’s endowment.

Major changes in this year’s Hop were elevating the quality of the music by bringing in the rock ‘n roll band Sha-Boom, and the quality of the food with a tri-tip dinner, said Hulick.

Another change was Pink Lady Amy Aoki’s mile-high hair, but what stayed the same was Linda Tarvin’s ability to swivel a hula hoop forever.

Financially, the event netted income of \$12,574, according to Hop Chair Ken Hulick. Gross income was \$24,107, plus \$8,000 in donated media space and \$11,000 in non-monetary goods and services. Expenses were \$11,533.

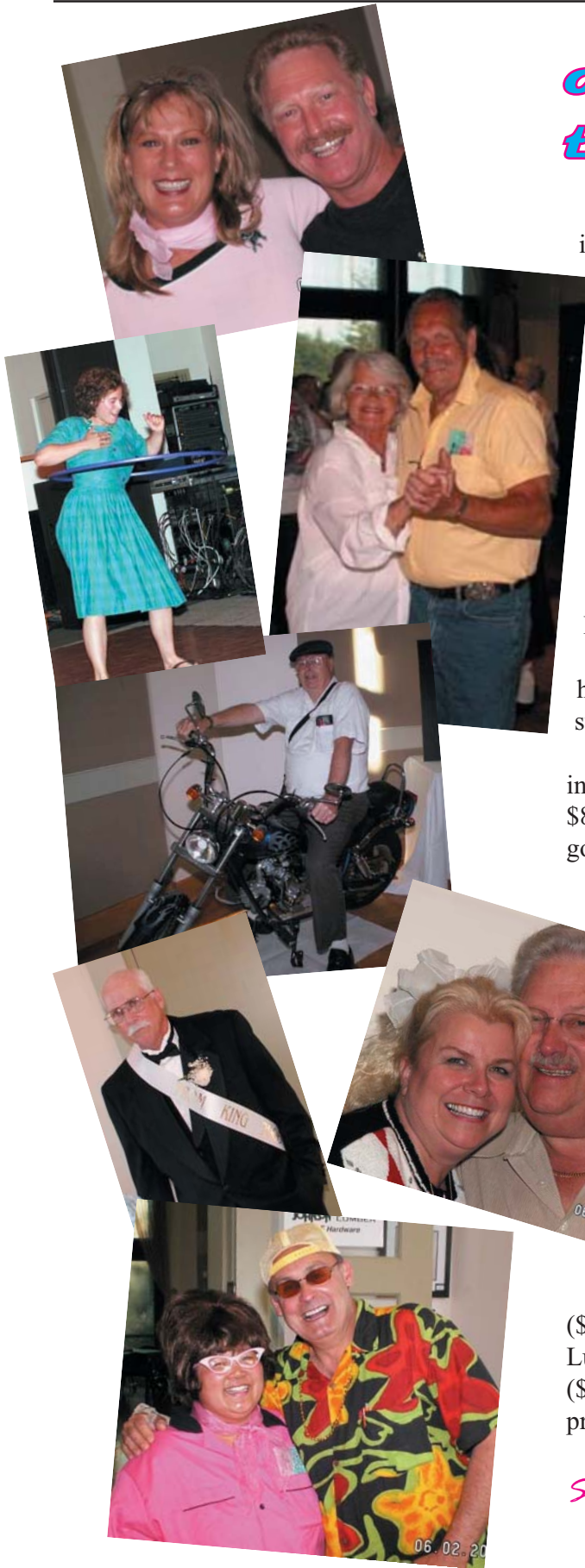
Fifty-six volunteers and six Interactors donated 2000 hours, the equivalent of almost one work year.

Attendance was 170, believed to be lower than last year because of graduation conflicts and holding the event on a Friday night.
